Dear Parents and Carers,

This week has been full and fruitful in lots of ways: we have really enjoyed a visit from Bishop Dibo, the Bishop of Cameroon. We welcomed him and his wife into school and they brought their Christian love and friendship to share with us. They joined our celebration assembly and the Bishop led us in prayer. School Uniform	 If you have ordered and received uniform, please could you make payment to the school office as soon as possible. We still have a number of outstanding payments. We are currently in the process of transferring the sale of our uniform to Game, Set & Match in Chichester. This means that you will be able to order your uniform on-line or call into their shop in Quarry Lane to try on and buy uniform there. They are open 7 days a week and have easy access and parking. We feel this will help us to improve the uniform service that we are able to offer by letting the 'experts' do a good job for us. It will also eliminate congestion in the reception when you need to purchase uniform and save space for us by not having to keep lots of stock of sweatshirts etc. We are confident that, although you may see a very small price increase in some items, the quality and service you receive will be excellent. This will happen for January but in the meantime, uniform will still be available to purchase from the school office. A list of uniform available from Game, Set & Match will be available shortly. We are also planning changes to our uniform in response to our Respect focus. We want our children to look as smart as pupils from other schools and we are planning some minor changes. These changes will be phased in from January onwards, when both styles will be worn. From September 2017, our new uniform will be fully in place: the major changes are that our logo will be embroidered, the sweatshirts will be V neck, and we will have ties for our older pupils. Our School Council will be working on taking some photographs of our sample uniform and this will be available shortly along with the pricing structure.

After a successful recruitment process we have shortlisted our applicants and have interviews scheduled for Monday morning.

Mrs Wendy Goacher and our other staff will support on the day, and we will all have the opportunity to have input so that we select the best person to join our West Dean team for the coming two terms. This process is always fascinating - it enables us to explore some key aspects of the candidates and to see how they relate to the children and how they approach the teaching role.

There is a possibility that the successful candidate may be the right person to join us on a permanent basis, but this will be considered later in the school year, as part of the role of our finance and staffing committee of governors.

Mrs. Turner is preparing to make her move to Bosham Primary School, where we hope she will be very happy. In the meantime, she and Mrs Goacher are throwing their energies into preparing KS2 children for our Christmas production and ensuring that the children keep up with their maths and English, as well as other curriculum areas.
