Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a wonderful week of **learning**, with many highlights. On Tuesday, Beech Class were privileged enough to enjoy the Tutankhamun Exhibition at the Saatchi Gallery in London. This is an experience few people will have and the children demonstrated their learning alongside superb behaviour throughout the day. Many members of the public complimented them on their knowledge, attitude and behaviour! See below or their report.

Chestnut Class performed a superb assembly full of their learning about The Titanic: this topic has been a fabulous vehicle for learning across all the subject areas and has captured our imagination.
