

## Updated Information for our Christmas events

We have a few amendments to our Christmas arrangements for this year - please see below - amendments are in green and red We all love the Christmas traditions at West Dean as they are so special to our school. With the current restrictions, we have adapted them to keep everyone safe, but we are ensuring that as much as possible still goes ahead.

We do need your support in this, however, in making sure your children have the right clothes on the appropriate days, and that you adhere strictly to our rules/protocols for joining our events on Zoom. We will continue to use Zoom to share assemblies and events until Easter, when we hope that restrictions will lift. We will not be able to do this, however, if we have issues around people filming, taking screenshots or allowing access to anyone outside school. Thank you in advance for your support.

Warm and waterproof outer clothes are essential each day this term and into the New Year please. Please note that we all stand outside for assemblies, even when it is cold and even if it is a bit drizzly - your children need appropriate coats, hats, scarves and gloves please!

With all our timings, we will need to be flexible as many of our plans are weather dependent. We will let you know as soon as possible of changes to the timing of the Christingle Service. We are hoping to record it and put it on the google Classroom class pages, so that you will be able to view it at your leisure - but we have not yet mastered this, so please do join us live if you are able to - please see attached Zoom protocol information.

In previous years we have 'sold' tickets for this event in order to manage numbers in Church but as this year is very different, we are asking that you make a donation to The Children's Society via our on-line payment platform <a href="www.schoolmoney.co.uk">www.schoolmoney.co.uk</a>. We suggest a minimum of £2.50, for those who can afford it, as this supports children who would have a bleak Christmas without our support.

We also ask that you support our **REVERSE ADVENT CALENDAR**—please see the front page for details.

On Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup>, when we visit the College to meet Father Christmas and sing carols, it is even more important than ever that children have waterproof coats and footwear (wellies or walking boots) for the walk to the College, please. This is a school only event and not for parents, apart from parent governors, thank you. It will be a lovely way to end the year and a Christmas treat for us all. Again, things are very different this year and we will not have access to the College, we will meet Father Christmas outside and sing some of our favourite Carols before heading back to school.

For the party day, Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> December, children should come to school wearing party clothes for the whole day: these clothes must be suitable for outdoor activities too, please. This will be an exciting day with a very 'Christmassy' feel: the morning will be spent on Christmas crafts and the afternoon will be our party afternoon. Our Chartwells' Christmas Lunch, will be on this day, too.

This year, we will keep the children and adults within their bubbles and they will all have their lunch and party games/quiz etc in their classrooms or outside. Our lovely PTA helpers are in the midst of preparing for this day, as are we, and we hope that we can make it extra special.

On Thursday  $17^{th}$  December, in the afternoon, our PTA have arranged for a **Pantomime** treat: this will be in our own classrooms and in school time.

Friday 18<sup>th</sup> December is the date for the end of year assembly, this will be for school adults and children only, and will mark the end of 2020 for the school.

Please note - we will remain open on this Friday, despite press coverage about some schools closing. We have been advised that we could take Friday  $18^{th}$  as an INSET day, but would then have to lose one of our planned training days later in the year. Some schools locally and nationally are doing this.

The government rationale behind this is to prevent schools closing early and putting learning on-line - this is not legal, but some schools have planned to do it: if we can continue face to face teaching, we are obliged to do so.

The other reason cited for some schools closing early, is so that school leaders will be spared the inconvenience and stress of being responsible for contact tracing during the Christmas period. If a child or member of staff tests positive for Covid, in the six days after our final day, and if their symptoms began within 48 hours of school closing, then we are responsible for contact tracing and you should email school immediately. (Public health England have agreed this six day period of school responsibility as they believe that cases are likely to be evident within a couple of days of school finishing).

Mrs Shears and I will guarantee to check emails between 16:00 and 17:00 hours each day. We will then let any 'contacts' know, so that people can isolate if required to do so.

There is no benefit to us closing early and disrupting families' childcare and working arrangements, or disrupting our Christmas week plans. Our INSET days are precious to us and will remain in February, June and July as planned. We are operating safely in school and will continue to rely on everyone at home doing the same.

## Christmas Cards

Thank you for your support with this. The boxes in school are filling up. This is a popular tradition for our children and we would like to enable it to continue - please help us in managing this very small but real risk of viral spread.

Christmas cards should not be brought into school next week as we cannot process them safely before the end of term. We will now leave the boxes of cards which have been brought into school untouched until Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> December, when they will be sorted and distributed. This is to allow time for 'quarantining'.

Any cards brought in before or after 7-11 December will **not be distributed**. Please refrain from distributing cards in the car park or playground, as we are responsible for keeping everyone safe on the school grounds.

## **GIFTS**

We have had an enquiry from a parent about bringing gifts for staff into school safely. I must make it clear that our team do not expect gifts! We are, however, grateful to know that you appreciate us! If you **do** want to send a gift in for a member of staff, then our office team will receive them in the entrance area, where they will be 'quarantined' for two days, and safely distributed in the staff room.

Throughout this Advent period, the vast majority of our timetable remains the same and we have the same expectations for work in classes and at home. Please support us in ensuring quality learning is taking place by making sure the children get plenty of sleep and continue to read at home and work on their targets. One aspect we have noticed is lacking in many of our children, is the ability to 'infer and deduce' - this is what we do when we ask children searching questions about stories or films - and it would be super if you can practise this at home. What might happen next? Why has a character done this? Why has the author chosen this word? Why has the author chosen this weather for this part of the story? What does xxxxxxx tell us about a character? etc etc You could do this whilst watching some of the Christmas films, perhaps!

We will ensure that Covid guidelines are strictly followed, whatever this may look like in the period leading up to Christmas.
