Dear Parents and Carers,

What an exciting end to our busy and very successful Autumn term! PTA have been very busy behind the scenes, helping with Christingles, Christmas lunches, Film Night and with the Father Christmas visit. Thank you to everyone. The children have enjoyed so many lovely Christmas treats, many of which have been carefully woven onto the curriculum! We continue to encourage languages and an understanding of a range of cultures and religions, from YR throughout the school, and children have learnt French Christmas words and written French Christmas cards, celebrated a range of festivals as well as learning about Advent and the Christian nativity.

We have, of course, had our party and a truly amazing visit from **Father Christmas**, who arrived in a helicopter this year! (Apparently his sleigh is already full of presents). The **Christingle service** was a beautiful reminder of the meaning of Christmas: it was well attended and the logistics for parking and seating worked well. Thanks to all of you for your support in making this safe and calm - no more rushing to arrive early for seats! We have been able to send £217.63 to the Children's Society to help troubled children, so thank you for your generosity, and we have been able to help homeless people with the proceeds from The Raggedy King, which was a particular treat for so many of us.

Plans are well under way for the **next two terms**. In the **Spring** term, we are opening the school for you to work with your children in February, the week commencing the 14th March is 'Alive and Kicking' week when we will focus on growing up healthy and safe, KS2 children will be swimming at Westgate once again (please see below) and we will be developing the children's skills in playing together in harmony. Our assembly theme will be Saints. Individual class teachers will let you know about the plans for learning in their classes. In the **Summer** term, we have a collaborative project planned where we will be finding out what we could be when we grow up, the children will be learning together using some beautiful text-free books as stimuli and we will open the school as a gallery for parents. These plans are all part of our **two year rolling programme**, so that our stage performances, some charity events and high profile focus on World Book Day, for example, will be on a bi-annual basis.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our dedicated team of staff and governors, who have made the term so wonderful for the children, and to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!

Mrs Moss' Road Safety Grumble

Generally, our car park has been much safer and less congested in recent months and I am grateful to everyone for being sensible and courteous in their parking.

May I remind you, however, that the school car park is too small to accommodate all parents and is therefore restricted to Apple Class parents only, and those with mobility difficulties. It has come to our attention that some parents of KS2 children are dropping children off in the car park and using the turning area for this. This is causing some issues for those attempting to enter, park and leave the car park safely.

Even more dangerously, some parents are dropping children off on the pavement on Motor Road, near the entrance to school. This can cause short tail backs – and this quickly causes a danger on the main A286.

PLEASE DO NOT DROP CHILDREN HERE.

We are pursuing the possibility of a traffic/crossing patrol and will keep you informed of our progress with this, as I am aware that the road is still dangerous for us all to cross.
