Dear Parents and Carers,

Please look out for some important information which has been sent home today, this is to support you in helping your children with their learning at home. Class Rep

We would like to ask for your help to assist us with communication between classes. We are seeking out any parents who would be willing to act as a PTA/ Class Rep to communicate news and information to other parents of children in that particular class. This has been really effective in the past, with Whatsapp groups etc allowing quick access to reminders and a means to share information. If you would be keen to get involved please do let us know.



A Plea for Help:

Beech Class Visit to Haslemere Museum by Leo Malan and Nell Stringer

We went to find out about ancient Egyptians and mummification and we looked at a time line.

We played some games and did some sketching and we had to decide which Egyptian figure was a relic and which was a copy.

We had a dummy and took its organs out with a hook. The organs were embalmed and put in jars.

The lady had a pop out Tutankhamun book.

We took our own toys which we mummified. We each got a roll of bandage and wrapped it around our toy and put some sequins in as treasures, we made a death mask for them using yellow card. "This was my favourite part", said Leo.

We also stuck a reed of plant which we had drawn hieroglyphics on and we wrapped it in bandages. (the Egyptians used linen). Some interesting facts:

Did you know that sun and sand can mummify people?

Cleopatra was not an ancient Egyptian.

Did you know that mummification comes from the word mummia which is what they used to stick the bandages down?

We hosted a GAS Cycle Event at West Dean School led by Cobnor Activity Centre. Four children from each of the GAS schools were invited to take part and we had two sessions, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. The weather wasn't quite so kind for the afternoon group.

Helping your children at home

The staff and I have been working hard to produce materials and information to support you in helping your children with their learning at home. The parent information letters and sessions have been very thorough, and the open mornings are very well worth attending whether your child is in YR or Y6, or somewhere in between! Research shows that help and engagement from parents has a huge impact on children's learning and life chances (more than most things we do in school!), so please do take time to make sense of the plethora of information and support available.

In addition to this information, we have produced a termly focus for **reading** chart, which will enable you to give more specific feedback to your children and in the reading records. This 'Book Worm Award Chart' explains some of the aspects of teaching reading with some suggested questions for you to focus on at home too. Our focus in the Autumn term is very much a **word and sentence** level focus, with the areas later in the year shining the spotlight on **non-fiction** and **inference** skills, for example. We will send these out with the newsletter, so that you have the appropriate support sheet for your child (there is one for each class). Please do use them to target your comments in the reading diaries/reading records: staff are rewarding children whenever they show that they are concentrating on the skills for that half term.

We will also send home a spelling support sheet - this is designed to be double sided. One side supports phonetic spelling (sounding words out) and the other supports children's growing awareness of words which are commonly muddled (eg: there, their and they're). In school, these laminated sheets are available in the classrooms so that we can all respond to any spelling confusions in a consistent way. For example, if a child is struggling to find the correct way to spell the 'f' sound in the word elephant, then we would remind them that it is spelt in a similar to the word photograph, which appears on the sheet. We might, for example, if they ask us how to spell flick, say that the 'c' sound at the end is the same as the 'c' sound in the word duck. Some sounds (phonemes) can be spelt in several ways (graphemes) eg: the long vowel 'o' sound can be spelt 'o' as no, 'oa' as in goal, 'ow' as in bow, 'o_e' as in bone and 'ough' as in dough. The colour coding and picture clues on the sheet help children learn these options and help them to recall their options.

We will also explore how, for example, the ck grapheme is always after a vowel and usually at the end of a root word, eg: sack, sacked, ransacking (where sack is the root word from which other words can be formed). This explorative method is much more effective than children merely learning a list of words. If children can understand that other words work in a similar way to sack, with the ck phoneme/grapheme, for example, they will be more likely to be able to spell and read words such as hacked, thickened, stacking, tricky, trickiest, etc. You will find that the spelling 'homework' and activities in class are largely around exploring and understanding how words work, and using them, rather than learning lists for simple 'tests'. Putting the words into sentences to demonstrate understanding, even just orally, is a good way of working with the words at home too. Linking spellings to handwriting is vital too. If children learn the 'letter string' which spells ing, they can add this to other words almost without thinking about it - 'muscle memory' supports learning too, and they learn that it 'looks right'.

This work on spelling and developing the associated reading and writing skills will be the focus of our parent information sessions, available and relevant for ALL PARENTS from YR to Y6, so that we can all consistently support children in becoming skilled and independent with their word skills. Please do come along if you are able. The dates for this term are:

Monday 2^{nd} October from 2:15 - 2:55 pm and Friday 6^{th} October, from 8:45 - 9:20am. You will also be able to find out more at the Parents' Evenings, where we will have some resources in the hall, along with the Report Books, for you all to preview.

We hope that you will all find these sessions and resources helpful. Our next information focus will be maths again, and we will circulate dates and information about this soon.
























The day-to-day operations of the school are overseen by the amazing staff. The administrative and financial duties of the business are the responsibility of the Parent Committee.


