Dear Parents and Carers,

Our PTA coffee mornings are going really well, with another planned for Thursday 19^{th} October - a relaxed opportunity to

chat and stop for a moment with a cup of **tea or coffee and a biscuit**. Our PTA committee are doing a super job of arranging this and are keen to continue to make this a regular event. We have a **welly walk and lunch**, planned for Sunday 15^{th} October. Information about dates and times are included here and flyers were with last week's newsletter. We also have a **Casino Night** lined up (Friday 10^{th} Nov), where we hope lots of you will help us to raise school funds and enjoy a night out in the process! Please do come along if you can - everyone will be made welcome.



Harvest Festival Assembly

Thank you to everyone who joined us for our Harvest Assembly this week, and for all of the lovely goods that were brought into school. These will all be donated to Stonepillow - St Joseph's Shelter in Chichester, to help the homeless. We had a collection at the end of our assembly and raised £22.89 and 5 Euro - thank you for your donations.

Late Arrivals

We have a number of children who are arriving late, either occasionally or regularly and frequently. I cannot impress upon you enough the impact that this has on the children's start to the school day and on their learning. If you can imagine arriving to an event when everyone else has already had a few moments' social chat upon arrival to help you to settle, and then they have organised their coats and bags, received instructions and are immersed in a task.......... and then you arrive....... probably a little unsure of what you should be doing....... And you have to quietly come in and find out where your group are up to. Sometimes the input and discussion for the class, or for your group has already happened and you have to have a quick resumé of this, before you begin your work. We constantly teach the children how important it is to be 'ready to learn': to have a positive mental approach, to be well hydrated, to be happy and relaxed, and wide awake. A late arrival results in children being far from 'ready to learn', despite our best efforts as grown ups to help them to settle quickly. It also disrupts the learning of other children, which is something we encourage children to avoid.

Just to clarify our timings: from 8:20, we have two members of staff on the playground to supervise children, which means adults can leave from then onwards. Children come into the classrooms, ready to learn, at 8:35, when the bell is rung. At 8:40, the register is taken. Any children arriving after this time enter through the main school entrance, so that we can ensure we keep children safe.

From Monday 9th October, we will have a 'late arrivals' book in the entrance area so that we can log those children who are persistently late, as this will help to explain inconsistencies in the progress for some children, and is an important record of our attendance. Please do complete the 'late arrivals' book, giving the reason for your lateness. Please note that this is a parental responsibility.

Children should be arriving at school with an adult - they will not put their own names in the book -we will expect the accompanying adult to complete this, please. I have asked our office staff to ensure this is adhered to.

This enables lessons to be 'in full swing' by 8:45 at the latest, and means that we make good use of the time we have in school.

Late Collections

On a similar note, please ensure that you collect children on time after school and clubs. Our staff have many other responsibilities and are wasting valuable time waiting for children to be collected.

Young Reporters

Beech Class go to Haslemere to see Egyptian Mummies!

On Wednesday 20th September, Beech class went to Haslemere Museum as part of our topic on the Egyptians. We went by coach and we had to bring our packed lunch. We saw lots of things there including a real Mummy at the museum! You can check out the mummified baby crocodiles, cats and a wooden cat coffin! Did you know that if the death mask's face is dark reddish, then the person was a boy and if yellowish brown, then it was a girl? We learned lots of facts during our visit.

Next to the mummified animals, there were toys and teddies. Everyone in Beech class brought a teddy to the museum and we wrapped them up in a type of bandage and wrote something in hieroglyphs on a sort of reed (the Egyptians used paper called papyrus) and stuck it onto our mummifies teddies. After that, we drew a death mask and stuck it to them as well.

We had a great day and it was really fun to see how the Egyptians mummified people and animals.
