### COVID safe procedures and routines

Following an update to the government COVID-19 operational guidance for schools, it is with great relief that we are able to make some changes to the timings of the school day for the start of the autumn term. We no longer need to operate a staggered start at the beginning and end of the day, so ask children in all classes to arrive on the school playground from 8.20am for an 8.35 start from Monday  $6^{th}$  September 2021. From 8.30am, children in Apple Class should be brought around the outside of the school building to the Apple Class outside area gate, where a member of the class team will be waiting to greet you. The school day will end at 3.00pm for all children, and we ask parents to arrive no earlier than 2.50pm for pick-up.

Whilst we are pleased to return to increased normality in terms of timings, we do so with caution and an awareness that this may need to change at any point in the coming months, depending on the pandemic landscape both nationally and locally. The government guidance requires all schools to have a contingency plan in place, to enable a swift tightening of COVID safe procedures, were there to be a 'local outbreak'. In addition, schools are advised to exercise caution at the times of the day when there are greater numbers of adult visitors on site. For this reason, I ask for your understanding and support in continuing to wear a face mask, on our school site, at dropoff and pick-up times. Whilst the teaching staff are no-longer required to wear a mask in class or anywhere else inside the school building, for everyone's safety, they will use a mask at the beginning and end of the day when greeting parents and carers. I will review this as the term progresses, but believe it is the best approach for the time being.

There is also no-longer a requirement for the children to remain in bubble groups while in school. Again, with caution, we will begin to provide greater opportunities for social interaction between age groups from the beginning of term, including at lunch and playtimes, as well as assembly. As with all other aspects of COVID safe practice, this is subject to change, and we have clear plans for the reintegration of bubbles, should the need arise. In the meantime, it is wonderful to be able allow the children to mix to a greater extent, as we have all so missed this important part of school life.

#### Parking

Parking permits issued last term will still be valid for the first week of this term. Parents and carers of children in Apple Class Year 1 are permitted to park in the school car park next week, but it will be necessary to change this when our Reception children start with us from Monday 13<sup>th</sup> September.

All other families with permits may still use the Selsey Arms pub carpark, but please limit your stay to the period required to pick-up your child, as the carpark is now increasingly busy with customers returning to the pub, which is a very positive sign for local business. As always, we are extremely grateful to the team at the Selsey Arms for the use of the carpark. Please therefore ensure that your driving and parking remains considerate to other users and customers, both in the pub carpark and on the school site.

The above arrangements will be in place for next week, during which time I will review school parking and be in touch again with a revised arrangements for this term.

#### Summer Works

The school has been a hive of activity throughout the summer break, as contractors have been on site installing a new boiler and heating system. There is talk of a heat wave next week, so I hope not to be testing the system yet, but it is good to know that we will all be kept comfortable as and when the colder winter months come. The contractors were on site until the middle of this week, so I am very grateful to the school staff team, who, in a very short space of time, have transformed the classrooms and prepared them for welcoming back the children.
