



Hot temperatures next week

As the MET office have today issued a Red Weather Warning for extremely high temperatures for next Monday and Tuesday, we want to reassure you of the plans we have in place for your children's health and safety, as well as that of our staff throughout this period.

We have not received any specific guidance on this matter and I sincerely hope that we will be able to run all planned events for the final week of our school year, albeit in a way that keeps everyone safe and as cool as possible.

- Please ensure that your child leave's their school tie at home if they normally wear one, as this isn't appropriate for hot weather. In addition, it is essential that they have a hat, water bottle and have applied sun cream.
- We will be stopping whatever we are doing for regular water breaks all through the day, when your child will be reminded to drink.
- Fans will be installed in every classroom, all windows and doors will be open and all blinds down, to encourage the flow of cooler air throughout the school building.
- Lunches will be eaten in the classrooms, as these are our cooler spaces and periods of time to sit outside in the shade will be staggered, so as to provide space for all of the children under the trees.
- Obviously we will allow the children to play, but these wil be limited to short periods of time and fast, energetic ball games will not be allowed during high heat.
- Above all, we will encourage everyone to be calm, keep fully hydrated and limit time out in the direct sun.
- We will make use of our wonderful swimming pool, but for shorter periods at a time.

Hopefully, by working in this way, we can enjoy the final few days of the school year and the warm weather in safety.
