Dear parents, carers and children,

A very happy new year to you all. I hope that your Christmas holiday was full of joy, peace and relaxation in equal measure. We begin 2022 with fresh hope for all that year may bring, but still with an element of caution in these continued times of uncertainty.

I am delighted that we have been able to return to learning in school as planned from the beginning of this term. It is a testament to all we have done in the run up to Christmas to keep everyone safe and healthy, and the support of you, our school families, that we remain relatively unaffected by COVID in school and indeed by illness in the wider sense. It was fantastic to see full classrooms on Tuesday morning, so thank you everyone, for your continued support and understanding.

The pandemic, and particularly the Omicron variant, remains an ever-present threat, which has led to us stepping up our safety measures slightly in school. Adults are now wearing masks all of the time, except when teachers are involved in direct teaching of their own class of children. We are also being very careful around our use of communal spaces, such as the staff room and offices, by limiting the number of adults in these spaces at any given time. At the moment, I am confident that this is an appropriate level of precaution for the current risk level, but this is of course subject to change, if the need arises.

We are, nevertheless, determined to offer the children the rich and broad curriculum opportunities that make learning fun and engaging, whilst ensuring that we 'learn to live with COVID' and operate safely and sensibly. There are a number of events and visits in the coming weeks, beginning with swimming at the Westgate Centre next Wednesday and Beech and Chestnut Classes' visit to Chichester Festival Theatre next Thursday. Please be assured that we have liaised closely with the Westgate Centre and theatre teams and have measures in place to enable these events to take place whilst mitigating the risk of COVID infection. Adults will be wearing face masks in the theatre, but there is no such requirement for children. However, if you would prefer your child to wear a mask, they are welcome to do so. Please ensure that your child has a mask with them if this is your preference.

Please do contact me if you have any COVID related concerns about either of these events.

Car Park news! You will no doubt have noticed that the fencing between the car park, playground and pathways is on its last legs. The good news is that a new metal fence and gates, designed to stand up to the West Dean weather will be installed during the February half term holiday. This will ensure that our children are completely safe during the school day and will, I am confident, provide a much-improved appearance to the entrance to school. Once the weather is a little drier, we will also be refreshing the car park space markings, including the designated space for disabled car park users. Please continue to support us in your courteous and cooperative use of the car park until this is possible.

During this week's assemblies, we have been looking at the theme of *Gifts* to reflect the celebration of Epiphany and the Magi's visit to the baby Jesus. We discussed how all of us have been given gifts, not just in the things we found laid under the Christmas Tree on the 25^{th} , but more importantly within us in the form of Special talents and qualities, some of which are yet to be discovered. My New Year's Resolution style challenge to the children is to celebrate their own special qualities, and to use the gifts within them, whatever they may be, to serve others. I also shared the story of Dame Gillian Lynne, who having been told that she was failing and totally incapable of sitting still at school during the 1930s, discovered that she actually had a natural gift and passion for dancing. Dame Gillian went on to become a Ballerina with the Royal Ballet and then one of the most successful Broadway choreographers of all time. I find that such an inspiring story that demonstrates the tremendous potential that each and every one of our children has within them.

Again, I wish you a happy and healthy new year and look forward with excitement to the adventures that lie ahead at West Dean in 2022.



We are, once again, limiting grown-ups in school. Please, only come into school if necessary. If you need to contact us you can give us a call or drop us an email and we will respond.




Let's all work together and do all we can to stay safe. Thank you for your continued support.
