Dear parents, carers and children,

It's a busy time of year isn't it? Bonfire Night, Remembrance Day, Grounds Morning, and in the midst of all that, plans being made and practice beginning for our celebration of Christmas.

It was wonderful to join many of you for Bonfire Night in the grounds of West Dean College last Friday. The fireworks were amazing and it felt a real privilege to be included in such a special community event. I'm sorry if I didn't manage to find you; the combination of almost complete darkness and disguising winter hats made it quite challenging to identify people. What was clear though was how much fun everyone was having, adults and children alike, so sincere thanks to the West Dean Estate for extending their invitation to our school family.

Speaking of community, I extend a very warm invitation to you all to join us for Ground Morning tomorrow, from 9.30 to 12.30. If you are able to spare an hour or two, or even the whole morning, to help clear and tidy our wonderful school grounds in preparation for winter, it would be hugely appreciated. I know how precious the weekends are, but I am sure the morning will be a fun and sociable occasion, and it will most certainly include some healthy exercise. Life is all about balance though right? So, in return, our brilliant PTA will keep you warm and fuelled with hot drinks and bacon sandwiches — the promise of bacon is definitely enough to get me out of bed on a Saturday morning!

There will be a list of jobs on display on the playground from 9.30 in the morning. Armistice Day was marked with a whole school act of remembrance on Thursday and I was particularly proud of the respect and deep thought that the children showed throughout, and the careful planning and delivery of the assembly by the children in Beech Class. We were incredibly fortunate to have the beginning and end of the two-minute period of silence marked by live playing of *The Last Post* and *The Reveille*, by Will Wilkin, our visiting cornet teacher from the West Sussex Music Team. This added an extra element of poignancy for everyone present, so huge thanks to Will for performing for us.

I shall be joining two West Dean children at the Remembrance service at St Andrew's Church this Sunday, as we lay a beautiful wreath, made by the Year One children and Ms Boxall during Forest School this week, at the village memorial.

Next week we will be supporting Children in Need with a spotty or stripy clothes day on Friday, followed by 'Film Night' the first of our PTA events for children this term; more details can be found later in this newsletter. Thank you to the PTA for all they are doing to support our children — they are so keen and excited to get events running again, after the challenge of the last two years. Finally, on a practical note, as late autumn / early winter is definitely upon us and the field is consequently increasingly soggy, a reminder that the children need to bring trousers AND a top to wear at playtime, particularly if they are intending to play football etc. I have noticed an increasing number of shirts and jumpers caked in mud this week, which quite apart from looking horrible and potentially being quite uncomfortable for the children, clearly creates unnecessary work for families in cleaning uniform ready for the next day.
