Dear parents, carers and children,

The spring term has settled into its stride and we've all been enjoying some much needed January sunshine this week, enabling the children to get outside and active. Six of our Year Three and Four children represented West Dean at the locality netball tournament at Bishop Luffa School on Thursday and proved themselves to be a very well-drilled and skilled team. The focus of the tournament was not on an overall winner as such, but our team enjoyed the success of winning their matches. Very well done to all who participated.

I am so pleased that inter-school competition has been able to start up again. There is more to come this half term, with a hockey event and the locality cross-country championships in a few weeks' time, which I am particularly looking forward to having watched our runners work so hard to develop their fitness and stamina at cross-country club this term and last.

Sadly, I have to announce that we will soon be saying goodbye to Mrs Wakefield, a highly valued member of our team, who as you know primarily works as a teaching assistant in Beech Class. #### **COVID** safe procedures and routines

The government continues to manage the risk of serious illness from the spread of the virus. The Prime Minister announced on 19 January that the temporary introduction of Plan B is to end. As a result, the Plan B measures in the guidance for schools are being removed, including the use of face masks in communal areas for adults.
