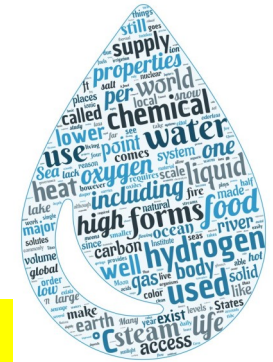

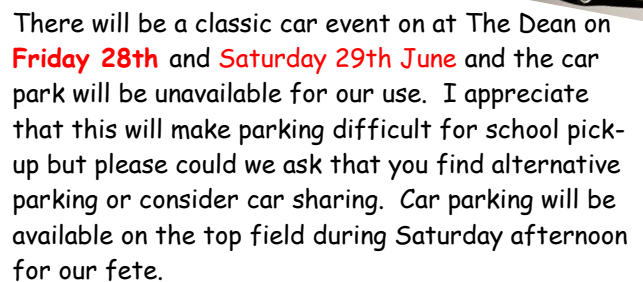


Our H2EAU Water Show will be supporting Water Aid charity (wateraid.org)

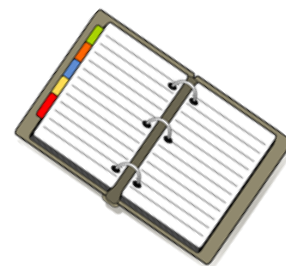
