Dear parents, carers and children,

I write this newsletter having just closed the polling station following a very successful Pupil Parliament election this morning. The children running for election as Members of Pupil Parliament (MPPs) were busy preparing and delivering their manifesto speeches to their respective classes during the first half of the week, including the children from Chestnut class who wish to represent Apple and Maple Class in the Parliament, who have had a chance to work in those classes so that their faces were known before the vote. As you can see from the photo taken this morning, someone above was telling us that it is the day to put an 'X' in the right box!

I am so proud of the children's sensible approach to the voting this morning. We tried to create as authentic a polling station as possible, with proper voting booths, clerks running the operation and of course the all-important ballot box. The serious job of counting now begins and the children will be told the results on Monday. As I said to the children in our Acorn Assembly this morning, regardless of the outcome, I am very impressed with all of the children who put themselves forward for election, and, although they can't all be elected, there will be other opportunities to be involved in the work of the Parliament.

Many of you will have witnessed the excitement during drop-off time on Wednesday morning, as we sadly said goodbye to one of the lovely trees on the school boundary. Due to the devastating impact of the disease ash-dieback, a large number of ash trees have had to be cleared along the route of Centurion Way, including some on the edge of the school site. Sad as it always is to lose trees, it is interesting to see the new views which are opened up in the process and it will be exciting to see the new growth which is encouraged within our forest school area as a result of the clearance. Year One were soon making good use of the freshly cut sections of tree trunk, as they arranged them as new seating around the fire-pit during Forest School on Thursday. You will have probably seen that the tree felling itself, and the incredible piece of machinery used, drew quite a crowd of spectators at drop-off.

Continuing the theme of clearing and maintaining our outside environment, I would be really pleased and grateful to see as many of you as are able to join us for our Grounds Morning on Saturday 13^{th} November, from 9.30am to 12.30pm. There will be a comprehensive list of jobs to work through during the morning, from sweeping and tidying the Apple Class outside area, to raking and pruning elsewhere on the school site. Please bring along any tools which you think would be useful; we have some, but more would be helpful. All workers will be rewarded with hot drinks and bacon rolls, kindly prepared by members of our PTA. It should be a fun and rewarding morning – prayers and fingers crossed for fine weather!

The following day is the nearest Sunday to Remembrance Day and consequently

this will be when this year's act of remembrance will take place at West Dean Church. Rev Sarah has invited us to take part in the act of remembrance, with hopefully several of our children laying a wreath at the memorial in church. I will be attending the service myself, but ask any of you who might be able to attend as a family, so that your children could lay the wreath on behalf of the school to please get in touch with me or Mrs Shears in the office.

The 16th and 17th of November will be our two Parents' evenings for this term. After taking advice from Headteacher colleagues in other schools in our locality and following concerning numbers of Covid-19 cases in the area, it is with regret that we are sadly unable to invite you into school in person for these meetings, and they will once again be run via Zoom. Many of you indicated in the recent parent survey that this is actually your preference anyway, but for those that didn't, I am sorry, we all hope to be able to welcome families into school again soon. Further details of how to make a Parent's Evening appointment will follow soon. There is a lot going on in the coming weeks as we approach the run up to Christmas, so please do take time to read the other diary dates and notices on this newsletter.

As you will have seen, we received an invitation this week for everyone in our wider school community to join in on the West Dean College fireworks and bonfire this evening from 6.30pm. This is a lovely invitation and a wonderful opportunity to develop our friendship with the college. I shall be there with my family and look forward to seeing you if you are able to join us.
