Dear parents and carers,

We are delighted to be able to invite you into school for Parents' Evening next week, on Tuesday and Thursday. You should have received details on Thursday of how to book your appointment. Of course, some aspects of the pandemic have taught us new ways of working, and we are pleased to also be able to offer Zoom appointments to those for whom this is more practical. If you are coming into school, do please take some time, either before or after your appointment, to view some of your child's books in the school hall.

Beyond Parents' evening week, we are re-introducing 'Drop-in Wednesday', which, for those of you who haven't heard of this before, is an opportunity for you to come back into class with your child at the end of the day on Wednesdays, just for ten minutes, so your child can show you some of the things they have been doing in class. We are very aware of how much many of you have missed coming into the school building, so we're really pleased to be able to offer this again. This is entirely optional and not necessarily something you need to do every week and will start from Wednesday 11th May.

Please keep our Year Six children in your thoughts and prayers, as they prepare for the Key Stage 2 National Curriculum Assessment (SATs) week, beginning on 9th May. The children have all been working very hard to build their confidence for this important week, but it has been, and still is, important to support them in understanding that despite its significance as an opportunity to show what they can do, there are many other ways that children can shine too, beyond SATs week, in sport for example or in the creative arts. SATs week is undoubtedly at time to focus and try hard, but it's important to put this into perspective for the children as well.

We are all very excited that, in the penultimate week of this half term, Chestnut Class will finally be off on a residential adventure, to Foxlease, near Lyndhurst in the New Forest. The children will be spending three nights away, challenging themselves and having lots of fun with all manner of outdoor and adventurous activities, as well as that all important, character building opportunity to share a dormitory with classmates! This is such an important element of the children's journey through primary school, so again, we're delighted that this year, the residential trip, albeit this side of the English Channel, can happen.

A group of budding writer's from Chestnut Class, enjoyed the opportunity to work on creative story writing with an author this week, at the 'Author's Abroad' event at Portfield School. We are pleased to be able to offer a programme of after school activities again for the summer term. These activities take place outside of school hours and are considered 'optional extras'. The charges that we make for these activities cover the cost of the provision, resources, admin and use of the school premises and facilities.

In addition to our after school club programme our Care Bear provision is available, **Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday**, 3.00-4.00pm. Please make sure that you book in, at least 24 hours in advance, if possible.

All clubs run from 3.00-4.00, with the exception of Cookery Club which finishes at 4.15.

Please contact the school office if you require a reminder of your log-in details.

Places for clubs are limited and will be allocated on 'first come, first served' basis. Please collect your child from the Reception area. Children will only be released to parents or carers unless we have been notified of alternative arrangements.
