Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back. I hope that you have all enjoyed the half term break. We have had an exciting day at Southampton University this week with Chestnut and Beech class exploring Nono-technology: some of their reports feature below.

Swimming has started at West Dean with some of our swimmers in the pool for the very first time, which has been a great cause for celebration and excitement! For after school swimming sessions we would like to ask you to support us in keeping everyone safe when leaving the premises: we will email everyone separately about this as we need to keep gates and doors locked, but to allow swimmers to go home before 4pm if necessary.

Nano-technology Day at Southampton University

Nano what? I hear you ask. Before I went to Southampton University, Nanotech was as alien to me as it is to you.

I remember it best by my feeling of inspiration as I watched white-clothed scientists prepare for an experiment from the corridor of the 'clean room'.

As you may have guessed, the 'clean room' was incredibly clean, so pristine that they even had doormats that dirt on your shoes stuck to!

Nano is one billionth of a metre and is used to measure things that are invisible to the naked eye. As an example, DNA is 2 Nanos wide.

The trip has convinced me that being a Nano-expert is a creative and unique career, and one I might pursue myself.

Car Parking:

A safety issue has been brought to our attention where children were in danger when being driven away from the school site. Please ensure that children have appropriate booster seats, where necessary, and that seatbelts are used at all times.

Save Our Swimming Pool:

Swimming has started at West Dean with some of our swimmers in the pool for the very first time, which has been a great cause for celebration and excitement! Thank you to those of you who have very kindly contributed the suggested £10 to help us with the cost of keeping the swimming pool up and running: just a reminder that this will allow you 'free' use of the pool during the times that it is open.

Please do make sure that you sign up on the rota if you are able to help with any

of our swim sessions. This means that your children will have access, to safe, supervised fun swim sessions after school and in the holiday.

For parents who have opted out of the £10 'free swim' payment, a 'pay as you go' system will be in operation for other children wishing to use the pool. A charge will be made for each swim session of £2.50 and children will only be able to swim if payment is received; no IOU's will be permitted. We feel that this is a fair way of making sure that all of our children can have the best use of the pool.

Please make sure that your child has their swim kit (named) in school every day this half term, we will try to swim as much as possible, weather permitting.

Please see a separate email which will help us to keep everyone safe after school whilst allowing after school swimmers to leave the premises - this will be sent out later today or on Monday.

Chichester District Foodbank	Thank you to everyone who supported us with donations to the Chichester District Foodbank; we are going to continue to have a box in the Reception area to collect any items that you would like to donate and Mrs Jen Rogers has very kindly agreed to make regular deliveries of our goods.					
Parent & Carer Drop-in Sessions	Every Wednesday 3.00-3.15 - Pop in and see your child's classroom and have a look at their work. Teachers will be available every Wednesday for informal chats - do pop in. We would love to have the opportunity to share your child with you.					
Care Bears	Care Bears After School Provision - this will run every day from 3.00-4.00. Please make sure that you have booked for your required places through www.schoolmoney.co.uk . Please make sure that you let us know, if you have booked a place and are collecting your child at 3.00, we are then able to release your Care Bears place to another child.

Late Arrivals	Just to clarify our timings: from 8:20, we have two members of staff on the playground to supervise children, which means adults can leave from then onwards. Children come into the classrooms, ready to learn, at 8:35, when the bell is rung. At 8:40, the register is taken. Any children arriving after this time enter through the main school entrance, so that we can ensure we keep children safe. From Monday 9th October, we will have a 'late arrivals' book in the entrance area so that we can log those children who are persistently late, as this will help to explain inconsistencies in the progress for some children, and is an important record of our attendance. Please do complete the 'late arrivals' book, giving the reason for your lateness. Please note that this is a parental responsibility. Children should be arriving at school with an adult - they will not put their own names in the book -we will expect the accompanying adult to complete this, please. I have asked our office staff to ensure this is adhered to. This enables lessons to be 'in full swing' by 8:45 at the latest, and means that we make good use of the time we have in school. 


