

As Advent draws nearer and we begin to prepare for Christmas at home, so we, at school, are making preparations. Our KS1 children are preparing for their performances of **Raggedy King**, and we are all preparing for our **Christingle Service**. Entry to both of these Christmas celebrations will be on a ticket basis only. Letters will be sent separately to communicate this. Chartwells Christmas lunch and the school party take place in the final week, and we will finish the year with a **Christmas assembly**, at 8:45am, to which you are all warmly invited. Please see the attached dates list for details and find out more about the Christingle Service and The Raggedy King from the separate letters.

On Monday 14th December, we will be **making our Christingles** in the afternoon, so please contact Claire Mitchell, Chair of PTA, or the School Office for details if you would like to come and join in. For the **Christingle Service** itself, we will be restricting numbers and allocating seats: entry will be strictly by ticket. By this method, we aim to ensure our congregation arrive safely, in a respectful and appropriate manner, so that children, staff and families alike have a positive experience. Initially, *tickets will be limited* to two per family, and, after Wednesday 9th December, further tickets will be allocated on a first come first served basis, if there are any remaining. Parents of YR pupils and pupils singing solos will be guaranteed seats nearer the front of the church, with those parents helping with the safe movement of people to and from the church also allocated seats at the front. This team of volunteers will support us with torches and umbrellas. We are lucky that West Dean Estate have kindly agreed to let us use the college car park: only parents of YR pupils, staff and anyone with limited mobility will park in the church car park. We will send a letter out to confirm the arrangements and for you to request tickets.

For the **party day**, children should wear school uniform but bring a change of clothing with them for the party, which is in the afternoon. It will be really helpful if party clothes can be in a named carrier bag please. For the Chartwells **Christmas Lunch**, our PTA and parent helpers usually come along to help, so please contact Claire or the Office if you would like to help and join in with this Christmas event.
