Dear parents, carers and children,

What a great week it has been, with more sunny weather and the absolute pleasure of getting out and enjoying the natural beauty of our local area with all of the children and staff for our Mindfulness and Wellbeing Day on Tuesday; more about that later.

Last Friday our Harvest Service at the church of St Andrew in West Dean was, as anticipated, a wonderful celebration on a number of levels. Not only was it good and appropriate for us to give thanks for the rich variety of food and provision that we receive in our lives, but it was also a wonderfully joyful occasion to be able to be back in church together, joined by Rev Sarah. My thanks to her for her warm welcome and leading of the service. Thank you also to you, our school families for navigating the one-way drop-off system at the church on Friday morning. There are always learning points and tweaks to make for the future, but on the whole it worked well, so I thank you for your support and cooperation. Your very generous harvest gifts were delivered to the Chichester District Foodbank on Wednesday morning and I have been asked to pass on sincere and heartfelt thanks from the volunteers who run this incredible, and sadly vital, source of support in our community. Your donations really will make a big difference.

Next week, I will be using our collective worship and assembly time to talk about politics, in preparation for the re-launch of our School Parliament. This may well be a new idea to those of you who are new to the school, or who joined during the COVID pandemic, as unfortunately, due to the limitations of working in 'bubbles', the parliament has not been able to function in its full form for around two years. Pupil Voice and valuing the ideas of the children about the way they want to develop their school life is extremely important to us. Plus, this kind of activity develops the children's understanding of the function of democracy in society.

I shall be introducing the children to the basics of how government and parliament work, and then launching a school election campaign to appoint members of School Parliament to the following departments or 'Ministries':

Learning for Life, Health & Wellbeing, Sustainability, Digital Technology and Community.

We will appoint a member to each department from Beech and Chestnut Class and two additional members from Chestnut Class, who will work with Apple and Maple Class children and represent their views at Parliament meetings. I encourage Beech and Chestnut children to consider nominating themselves for these roles and if they wish to do so, budding politicians will need to prepare a short campaign speech over the half term holiday to present to the rest of their class during the first week back, which will be 'Election week'. I'm sure it will be lots of fun, as well as being an important first step in developing this valuable aspect of school life.

It was fantastic to join the PTA for their first meeting of the year last Wednesday evening. I am so grateful for the willingness and enthusiasm of this group, in organising exciting school events and much-needed fundraising to enrich and support the children's learning. There are some great events on the horizon, including a film night for the children, a family grounds day to help prepare our site for winter, and, if it isn't too early to mention Christmas, a disco for the children towards the end of term. Whilst we welcome your support in all of these events, we have decided that we will wait until the spring before we look to organise any indoor events for adults, by which time we hope that the COVID pandemic landscape will look a little clearer.

Thank you for your incredible response to the recent Parent Survey. At the time of writing, we have received an impressive 44 responses from a school community of just 67 families, which is very pleasing indeed. Your responses make for very interesting and useful reading and will be invaluable in helping to inform our ongoing school development.

Finally, I will round off this week by adding my thanks to our school staff and to West Dean College, for enabling such a memorable and uplifting Mindfulness and Wellbeing Day last Tuesday. We are so blessed to have West Dean Gardens and the South Downs on our doorstep and Tuesday proved to be such an energising and rejuvenating experience for children and adults alike, following the limitations of the past few years. We hope it will have given the children the opportunity to refocus and reorientate themselves, rediscovering that love for learning with which to move forward. We have gathered our memories of the day in a video, which we will share with you. I hope you enjoy it and that it conveys the sense of calmness and rejuvenation that we all experienced.

#### The Museum of the Moon at Chichester Cathedral

- will be on display from 25th October - 14th November 2021. Measuring seven metres in diameter, the Museum of the Moon features 120dpi detailed NASA imagery of the lunar surface. At an approximate scale of 1:500,000, each centimetre of the internally-lit spherical sculpture represents 5km of the moon's surface. The artwork will be accompanied by a programme of events, concerts and late-night openings, delivered by a

variety of organisations, including the South Downs Planetarium, Chichester's Novium Museum and the West Sussex Library Service, encouraging people far and wide to celebrate the night skies of Sussex. Read on below to find out more. General day entry will not be ticketed or pre-booked, however a variety of events and evening viewings will need pre-booking.
