Local School Closures

Please find below some recent information regarding the closure of small schools in our area. It is worth noting that WSCC have a strategy, which is explained in the 'consultation documents': in this strategy, it clearly states the long term aim to reduce the number of small schools. There is no immediate threat to our school, but it is worth us all being aware of this strategy and the need to remain full and thriving, serving our community and providing fabulous education. I am passionate about the value we provide—I see us as 'value for money' rather than cheap! Per head, it is likely that education may cost WSCC more at West Dean than in some other larger primary schools, but we are unlikely to be on the 'hit list' currently for many reasons, some of which are highlighted below.

- We have high attainment and progress
- Transition from early years and to secondary provision is strong
- We offer inclusive education
- Our 'disadvantaged' pupils and those with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) and achieve well
- We are financially secure in the short and medium-term (although this will depend on fund-raising and future local and national budgetary decisions)
- We work effectively in partnership with all our stakeholders and other agencies
- Every year group in school is 'full' we have an admission limit of 14 pupils for each year group and are up to 14 or 15 throughout

WSCC definition of a 'small school'? In West Sussex a small school is defined as a school with 100 or fewer pupils. Central government uses a variety of measures for minimum pupil numbers for schools. The County Council will use these to support our guiding principles for primary schools which, wherever possible, should have a minimum of one form of entry (1FE), 210 places, and ideally a maximum of three forms of entry (3FE), 630 places (although there may be some exceptions). Recent guidance from the Department for Education is that all new primary 'Free Schools' should be no smaller than two forms of entry (2FE), 420 places. However, we recognise the need for sufficient high quality pupil places in all areas to meet local demand and so there is no wish from the County Council to have a uniform size of school provision across the County. We recognise the value of small schools in providing education and also in meeting the needs of their local communities. This is particularly the case in isolated rural communities. However, where some areas are seeing a decline in school aged children or are unable to secure a sustainable role from within the communities they currently draw from, it is important for the local authority to consider how it can best provide a sustainable education across the wider community. Much is being said about the climate emergency and, as much as is feasibly possible, we would encourage children to attend their local schools to reduce transport and carbon emissions.
