Centurion Way Project Update

I am delighted to be able to update you on the progress of the cycle path behind school. The Centurion Way has been extended by the South Downs National Park Authority, upon consultation with the local community, using funding from the Department for Transport. This money had to be used within quite a short timescale which meant that, given the limited funding available as well as the time required for consultation and planning, the path terminates in West Dean, behind school, with no official access to school or the village. The intention has always been to open the path up to the village when a safe exit point could be agreed, and I am pleased to say that this has been achieved. Planning is being sought for a ramp which will bring cyclists and walkers onto Motor Road just behind our car park, near Pre-school. In the long term, it is hoped that this will be a permanent permissive route, enabled by the support and consent of the landowner, the Edward James Foundation. The long-term ambition is to extend the route to the South Downs Way, Cocking and ultimately all the way to Midhurst!

Importantly for us, we should soon have school cycle storage funded by the SDNPA, as this was part of the agreement following consultation with our School Council and community. Please do be sensible for the time being, until the ramp is in place, as the current slippery slope being used is dangerous and involves trespassing on the land of the very landowners who are supporting the project. Please see the attached leaflet for more information.

We have had some exciting offers of involvement in our workshops and job fair, and we really look forward to giving the children the opportunity to learn about the variety of jobs and careers out there.
