

Dear parents, carers and children,

It's been a wonderful week in school, with much excitement and laughter as the children have enjoyed the various Christmas events, including visiting Father Christmas at West Dean College, watching the pantomime, feasting on a fantastic Christmas lunch and of course, gathering in the church today for our Christingle and Carol Service.

Whilst it is a great shame to be unable to include adults and family members in our celebration of Christmas this year, I can assure you that the magic has been well and truly kept alive for the children. My sincere thanks to all involved in



arranging such a fantastic programme of fun activity for our children - school staff, members of the PTA, West Dean College Staff, Rev Sarah and the church community, friends and families. We are very grateful for your generous support and the time you give to our school.

The Christingle and Carol Service was a magical and fitting end to the school term and made me feel so proud of our community. The children all sang beautifully and our Year Six children read from the Bible with clarity and confidence. The children will be bringing their Christingles home with them today, and should be able to explain the symbolism of each element. It really was beautiful to see them singing Away in a Manger by the light of their Christingle candle.

Before I wish you all well for the Christmas holidays, I do need to address the increasing anxiety around the rising number of COVID cases, and consequently the questions over a potential third lockdown.

As explained last week, the government remain steadfast in their aim to keep schools open for in-school learning, and that remote learning must be avoided unless absolutely necessary. I have not been given any direct indication from the government or local authority that a further lockdown and period of remote learning is likely, but I do think that it is vital to have plans in place to able to switch to that mode of operating at any time, should the need arise. As it stands, school will reopen for the spring term on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> January. Any change to that, resulting from the government moving to a higher level of COVID response, will be followed by an email communication to you from me, as soon as possible, but only when I have gathered all updated information. If the Prime Minister makes an announcement at any stage, it would be helpful if you could refrain from contacting the school with questions, until after I have made that initial contact with you. I am sure you will understand that experience has taught us that there is usually quite a lot of detail to clarify first, in order to communicate a clear and consistent message to parents and families.

I also urge families who have not yet accessed their child's Google classroom to please do so, as this will be our main point of teaching and learning and communication with the children, should there be a switch to remote learning in the future. Accessing it now, will make that process easier, should a further lockdown arise. Again, as I said last week, I do not intend to worry you, but rather to provide assurance that all potential scenarios are being actively considered, so that we are ready to respond at any time.

Exciting news – our new look school website has gone live. Please do have a look. At this stage, it is simply a new 'look' and style that has been applied to the existing content, with the aim of giving a fresher, more modern feel that celebrates the unique location of West Dean School in the heart of the South Downs. In the New

Year we will begin to focus on reviewing, revising and refreshing the content on each page as well, so please bear with us if certain elements of the new site, don't look quite right yet. I hope you will agree that it is a great start though.

It is hard to believe that my first term as Head of West Dean Primary School is almost over; the weeks have flown by, but when I reflect on the past three and a half months, a great deal has been achieved. I thank you all sincerely for the tremendously warm welcome that the whole school community has shown me, and for your energy, enthusiasm and eagerness to embrace the gradual change that new leadership inevitably brings. West Dean is a wonderful place to work and learn, and I feel very proud to be leading this community on its next exciting steps. There is much to look forward to in 2022!

I hope you have a wonderful Christmas with your families and send you my very best wishes for a healthy and happy New Year. I will sign off for 2021 with the words of the Christmas Blessing, which Rev Sarah used at the end of our church service this morning:

May the joy of the angels, the eagerness of the shepherds, the perseverance of the wise men, the obedience of Joseph and Mary and the peace of the Christchild be yours this Christmas; and the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always. Amen.

**Google Classroom is central to our remote learning provision**, so we want to ensure that you have access to this now, so that transition to learning online can be quick and seamless, should the need arise. I ask all parents and carers (if you have not already done so) to log-in to your child's Google Classroom account, so that the system recognises your child as a member of the class. This is particularly, although not exclusively needed for families of children in our younger classes, as the older children are already using Google Classroom regularly. This is a valuable route for communication and contains important information relevant to your child's class and learning.
