Dear Parents and Carers.

I am delighted with the atmosphere in the classrooms and at playtimes: all the children have come back with such enthusiasm and positivity. They are an example to us all! HEALTH AND SAFETY LOGISTICS

Thank you to everyone for being so supportive as we navigate the logistics of keeping everyone safe before and after school. Everyone seems to have different expectations and tolerance levels regarding social distancing, so we hope that we now have a very clear approach for our school grounds—see the pages at the end of this newsletter.

We continue to adapt to changing legislation and advice, but please be aware that your behaviours over the weekend will have an impact too—any positive or suspected cases mean disruption & risk for us all.

We hope that we can maintain this safe approach in the village and in The Selsey Arms car park. Nikki has been so generous in helping us throughout lockdown, and in allowing us to use their car park. It is vital that we support her in maintaining the safe access to the pub, adequate parking for her staff and paying clients/residents, so please do be considerate.

There is parking in the village, and, although it may take a few minutes to walk to school from the bottom of the village, we would prefer this to hazardous parking and dangers when crossing the road.

Car Parking Information

School Car Park: Only parents with children with pre-school age or in Apple Class will be allowed access to the car park immediately before school and at pick up time. Other parents will park in The Selsey Arms car park or in the village, and walk into school via the pedestrian gate.

Two appropriate spaces will be available for parents with **limited mobility**. Parents' vehicles will, therefore, be parked up towards Pre-School. The area near the bins should be kept clear, as staff parked there often need to leave school on business and must not be blocked in.

The children have designed parking permits, which have been sent home previously to Apple class parents who drive to school and to any parents with limited mobility. Permits should be displayed in windscreens please.

For parents of pupils in Maple, Beech and Chestnut classes, if you regularly carry passengers who are of pre-school age you may apply for a permit, please ask at the school office. Parking around 4pm when collecting children from clubs will be available to all parents, but please park carefully and supervise children well.

The disabled parking bay, adjacent to the fence at the edge of the playground, must be kept free for Blue Badge holders please and care taken not to block this space or park too closely either side. Whilst we appreciate that this is a challenge at times, especially for the drivers of bigger cars, please fill all parking spaces rather than parking near the disabled parking bay. Any cars found to be blocking the disabled bay will be banned from the car park; we have the right to exercise this option.

If anyone has any information about the accident that happened in the car park on Monday, please could you let us know in the office.

Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you so much for your support in improving our social distancing this morning at 'drop off' time. This newsletter should clarify our proposed morning and afternoon routines, now that we are fully back in school.

Whilst it is really important for all of us to communicate 'normally' with one another, chatting in person (rather than on Zoom!) and being friendly and caring, we are all very aware that we need to be mindful of the dangers of viral transmission. The inevitable increase in incidence of Covid-19 cases as businesses, schools and social groups return to closer proximity means that we all need to be extra careful. We are all navigating the priorities of keeping everyone safe, avoiding anxieties and educating our children effectively.

Please do think carefully about having any 'get togethers' over the next few days. Monday is the official start of the six in a 'get together' ruling but we are very keen to act responsibly to avoid any cases in our community, so we urge increased caution from today please. Symptomatic children will continue to be sent home so that you can then be tested/isolate as a family and return to school if the results are negative: the implications to the school, and the wider community, of a positive case are significant.

We are following Public Health England guidance and have worked with WSCC to ensure our risk assessments are robust, and will keep you all informed along the way. If we have one confirmed case, we are advised that the wider 'bubble' need not isolate, but should come to school as normal. This is a difficult time, with many grey areas and changing advice. I intend to inform families if we have any confirmed cases, so that individual families can be aware of the risk levels and act accordingly. If I feel we need to close a bubble or the school, then I will take that action, upon consultation with PHE and our governors.

In the meantime, the new government mantra of 'Hands. Face. Space.' is one we will use in school as it is clear and will be effective in reminding us all of the actions to minimise the spread. Let us hope and pray that we can all stay safe and that school will not be disrupted. Please refer to the following for guidance on before and after school organisation.

Morning Drop Off:

If you have only KS2 children:

Arrive between 8:30 and 8:40. Drop your children and leave as soon as you are able—our staff will ensure children's safety from 8:30. Children should wait in the designated area until 8:35 when they will be sent/taken in through the appropriate door. If you arrive any earlier, please wait in your car.

If you have only KS1 children:

Please bring them onto the playground between 8:45 and 8:50, to avoid KS2 children and their parents. Bring children to their designated areas and leave as soon as you are all comfortable to do so. Staff will be available to ensure safety and to send/take children in.

If you have KS1 and KS2 children:

You should encourage your KS1 children to stay with you in the Pavilion area upon arrival, and you should send them to their area when the KS2 children have gone inside. Your KS2 children should go straight to their areas, please



Afternoon Pick Up:

If you have only KS2 children:

Collect your children from their area **at 3pm** and avoid arriving earlier as we will have KS1 parents and children on the playground.


If you have only KS1 children:

Please collect them from the playground at 2:50, from their designated areas, to avoid KS2 children and their parents.

If you have KS1 and KS2 children:

You should encourage your KS1 children to stay with you in the Pavilion area upon collection, and you should leave when your KS2 children have joined you.

Please take your children straight home when they arrive on the playground. Please arrive on time. If you are very early, please wait in your car.
