Dear parents, carers and children,

The sun is shining again and we have made it safely and happily to the end of the first half term of the year. I cannot believe just how fast seven weeks have flown by and, at the risk of repeating myself, I thank you for your warm welcome and support since my arrival at West Dean Primary School. Having got to know you all a little better, I think it is appropriate to repeat something, which I think I said in my first letter to you; this school is already thriving, and there is much to look forward to and be excited about, as we journey together on our next stage of development.

This week's assemblies have focused on two themes; a celebration of Black History Month and an introduction to democracy and government. These are big themes, and ones which I can say with confidence that many adults struggle to fully understand, but the children have responded brilliantly, with a keenness to demonstrate their understanding through the launch of our new Pupil Parliament after the half-term break.

The key idea linking these two themes is of course that of showing respect, tolerance and value towards others, regardless of difference or background. As our school vision and the passage from John's Gospel reminds us, to truly 'Love one another, as I have loved you, so must you love one another'. The children have also learnt that equality and valuing the voice of everyone has not only been a long and hard fought struggle, but is also not yet where we would like it to be ultimately. Looking at the life of Dr Martin Luther King and the achievement of Paul Boateng, who became Britain's first black cabinet minister in May 2002, the children have developed their understanding of the role of democracy in giving everyone a voice.

The first week back after half term will be Pupil Parliament Election Week. As explained last week, Beech and Chestnut Class children have been encouraged to run for office in one of five parliamentary departments; Learning for Life, Health & Wellbeing, Sustainability, Digital Technology and Community and will need to prepare a **short (1 minute) speech**, which they will deliver to their class in support of their own nomination on Monday and Tuesday of the first week back. Our school hall will then be set up as the official 'Polling Station' for the pupil voting to take place later that week. Exciting times, and a really important part of ensuring that pupil voice is heard and can impact ongoing school development.

Along a similar theme, I will be launching Parent Forum meetings next half-term, in which you will be invited to share your views on school development themes via a panel of parent class representatives. I have experience of running Parent Forum in my last school and have always found this to be an effective way of involving the parent body in the development of new initiatives and strategic thinking. The idea is that you will be able to communicate points that you would like raised at Parent Forum to your class parent rep, who will then pass this on to me for discussion at a Parent Forum meeting. Initially, the forum will be attended by me, the parent reps and potentially several other members of teaching staff, but I will review whether this could be opened up to a wider group later this academic year. The other function of the group is to provide an opportunity for us, the teaching staff, to share plans and ideas for school development with a representative group of parents. For example, were we to consider changes to any school systems or routines, or perhaps uniform or reports to parents, Parent Forum is a good way to gauge parent opinion before making significant decisions. I look forward to working with the parent rep group and hope that this will prove to be an effective way to hear your views.

I have made it something of a mission this half term, to try to get out and about with the children on some of their school trips. This is such a great way to get to know them, and to see the way that they learn and interact in a completely different context to the classroom. For me as headteacher, it is so important to have a deep understanding of the children we serve, so whilst I'm unlikely to be able to go on every trip sadly, it's been wonderful to share in a few over the past weeks. This week's treat was accompanying Beech Class to my old stomping ground in Portsmouth, visiting the Naval Dockyard and HMS Victory. It really was a fantastic day; not only were the children incredibly excited to explore the historic flagship itself, and stand on the actual spot where Admiral Horatio Nelson fell exactly 216 years ago this week, on 21<sup>st</sup> October 1805, but they worked incredibly well as a team, solving a treasure hunt to reveal more facts about naval history in the Victory Museum.

They really were fine ambassadors for West Dean. What a fantastic way to round off a successful and happy half-term!

### The Museum of the Moon at Chichester Cathedral

## Art Projects for Schools - Christmas Cards


