Dear Parents and carers,

In just the few weeks since I last wrote to you, so much has been going on in school, with summer term learning really coming alive in all manner of ways.

As you know, at the end of last week, the children enjoyed a really successful day of learning at West Wittering Beach, organised by Mrs Bowman, our SENCo, who is also a trained Beach School practitioner. Mrs B planned a series of four activities, around which each class rotated throughout the day, including beach sport, an exploration of the coastal wildlife of East Head and the sand dunes, beach art and beach builders.

Although on our doorstep, this naturally stunning coastal environment is in complete contrast to the equally stunning setting at West Dean, so the children were incredibly excited to have the whole day to explore with their classmates, asking brilliant questions about the things they were finding on the beach and learning about the work being done to protect the wildlife and ecosystem in and around Chichester Harbour.

As always, your children were impeccably behaved, worked brilliantly together as a team and showed tremendous gratitude for this exciting learning opportunity.

We hope to make this a regular fixture in the calendar each year and, in collaboration with West Wittering School, invite their children to West Dean to explore the South Downs and perhaps some Forest School. We are, of course, extremely grateful for the financial support of this trip from the PTA, and therefore ultimately from you, without which, valuable trips such as these would be more challenging. Thank you also to our school staff for ensuring that it was a safe, happy and valuable day for everyone.

The momentum has certainly been increasing over the past few months in schools sporting events, which has been great to see again, following a few years of absence. Last Saturday it was the turn of our swimmers to take centre stage at the annual Chichester Cormorants Schools Swimming Gala. You will know that West Dean has achieved an impressive record at this event over the years, but due to the reduced opportunity for swimming during the pandemic, the children and teachers had to work really hard to be gala ready, through our swim club and additional training sessions this term. It was an incredibly exciting evening at the Westgate Centre, with all of our children giving their all in every event. We won some races and in others, were incredibly impressed by several of our children who stepped in as a replacement to swim races at the last minute, following some illness in the team. We finished a close fourth to Jessie Younghusband in third; congratulations to Bosham Primary, who won the gala and to all of our swimmers for such an amazing display of commitment and team spirit.

On Monday I had the pleasure of accompanying our Year Six children to the Diocesan Primary School Leavers' Service in Chichester Cathedral, where we joined children, staff and families from around a dozen other church schools from across the Chichester Diocese, including our closest neighbours, Lavant and Singleton. It was a lovely service, featuring contributions from the children through readings, prayers, acting and singing, and was a poignant reminder of the very special Christian community to which they have belonged during their time at primary school and continue to be as they move on in their school journey.

Speaking of community, it has been such a joy to welcome families back into school for each of our class assemblies over the past few weeks, including both the Apple Class and Chestnut Class assemblies this week. We know how you have all missed being involved in this aspect of your children's learning and in sharing in their achievements in this way, so we really are delighted that you have been able to join us this term.

The children's presentation skills at all ages really have been outstanding and their enthusiasm for learning and deeply developing understanding of the links between various aspects of their learning has been wonderful to witness. Very, very well done children for such clear, confident, informative and entertaining assembly presentations, of which you should be very proud. We look forward to welcoming families into school again in a few weeks as the children share the work they will have been doing related to Mexico, during our special themed learning week.

Thank you to those of you who have already responded to the parent and carer survey sent out on Wednesday this week. Your feedback really is invaluable in shaping ongoing school development. The survey will be open until the end of the day on Monday 4th July, so please do take a few minutes to respond this weekend, if you are able. Places for clubs are limited and will be allocated on 'first come, first served' basis. Please collect your child from the Reception area. Children will only be released to parents or carers unless we have been notified of alternative arrangements.
