Dear Parents and Carers,

As we near the end of our first term for this academic year, we are really starting to see the 'fruits of our labours'. All the children, in all the classes, are experiencing so many successes both inside and outside the classroom. We can see evidence of this in class assemblies: we had Maple and Beech assemblies this week and they both wowed us with their work and their ability to present so well. The confidence and enjoyment shone through, as well as the range of curriculum areas covered in class, all linked in very meaningful ways. We can also see lots of strong progress in lessons and in books, in social interaction and in play.

Our clubs have been really successful as well this term, we have had: some lovely craft produced, including Christmas wreaths; some tasty and quite complex cooking (which staff sample on a Wednesday during our staff meeting as part of the monitoring process!); some advanced art work; some super sports and fun aerobics; French; a swimming club where even some of our younger children are forging ahead with their strokes and confidence; Think Tank where children are experiencing the satisfaction of completing homework tasks and working on targets; debating club where there is some higher level thinking beginning to grow; string club where our young musicians are doing really well working together and our dancers are in the midst of creating and practising a hugely entertaining and energetic dance, which we will perform at the Alexandra Theatre on 30th January.



MATHS MATTERS - come into school and find out how we teach calculation!

It was wonderful to see so many adults at our parent information sessions – our focus was addition and we had hugely positive feedback about how useful this has been so far. We will be making resources availbale to support maths at home as soon as we are able, and we will publish advice about books and websites etc too. In the meantime, we are starting our sessions on subtraction next week, so please do come along if you are able: but let the school office know please. We will only run the evening session if we have enough parental interest!

Our PARENT WORKSHOPS/ INFORMATION SESSIONS

are where we will be demonstrating how we teach calculation. This is a really valuable opportunity to find out which vocabulary we use and how we move children on from working with small numbers to solving complex maths problems at the end of KS2. Do you know how to partition numbers? Can you multiply two digit numbers? How would you help your child dividing numbers? Come and find out how practical resources, pictures and an understanding of mathematical vocabulary supports learning.

and how you can help at home.

In the meantime, are you and your children making the most of the Maths Matters Challenges, Sumdog on your computers/tablets and the sample questions at the end of the newsletters? If you take advantage of these things, you will really be supporting your child's development well.

We are repeating each workshop/session three times: we hope that this enables everyone to come to one session for each of the four operations/rules of number/calculations.

Please don't be put off by any of the content, even if you don't know how to do long division!

We won't be putting anyone 'on the spot' but will be demonstrating maths

and how we do it at all levels from YR to Y6.

We will also be providing some booklets showing how you can support at home, guidance on how to explain things, support with which vocabulary to use and a clear picture of the progression from basic counting to manipulating complex numbers.

Please let Mrs Bailey know which sessions you are attending, by phoning, emailing or popping in, as soon as possible, as the sessions require quite a bit of preparation. Ideally, you will attend one session for each of the four maths operations, so that you are confident in supporting addition, subtraction, multiplication and division

| Late Arrivals | Just to clarify our timings: from 8:20, we have two members of staff on the playground to supervise children, which means adults can leave from then onwards. Children come into the classrooms, ready to learn, at 8:35, when the bell is rung. At 8:40, the register is taken. Any children arriving after this time enter through the main school entrance, so that we can ensure we keep children safe. From Monday 9th October, we will have a 'late arrivals' book in the entrance area so that we can log those children who are persistently late, as this will help to explain inconsistencies in the progress for some children, and is an important record of our attendance. Please do complete the 'late arrivals' book, giving the reason for your lateness. Please note that this is a parental responsibility. Children should be arriving at school with an adult - they will not put their own names in the book -we will expect the accompanying adult to complete this, please. I have asked our office staff to ensure this is adhered to. This enables lessons to be 'in full swing' by 8:45 at the latest, and means that we make good use of the time we have in school. Late Collections On a similar note, please ensure that you collect children on time after school and clubs. Our staff have many other responsibilities and are wasting valuable time waiting for children to be collected. | | | | |
