Dear Parents and Carers,

Our Community Café for the Queen's 90th **Birthday** is well underway and looks as though it is going to be a huge success. The children in Chestnut Class are working well together as a team and the weather looks set to be fair. Don't forget the local village tea party, 3pm - 10pm on Sunday 12th June on the lawn in front of West Dean College. (See last week's newsletter for details)

Thank you to all of you who helped out with our **Grounds Day** last Saturday. We had a small but dedicated team of adults and children who worked hard for a few hours and thoroughly enjoyed the social aspect as well as the satisfaction of getting so much done. We repaired shed roofs, painted the swimming pool fences, sorted the garden 'working area', cleared the tyres for children to dig and play in, and laid paving slabs around the chicken run. We are now looking to source some diggers and trucks for children to play with in this area and some buckets and spades etc for the sand pit: please do send in any such toys if your children can spare them/have 'grown out of' them. (NB: the diggers etc will need to be fairly chunky ones and not pocket sized, ideally! Tonka Toys would be the ideal, but something similar would go down really well)

We are constantly making adjustments to our staffing, routines and systems in response to the everchanging needs of the children, and we are well underway with our planning for next academic year. We have made minor changes to **lunch time routines** in order to: reduce movement around the hall when we are eating; encourage good table manners and safety in the hall; to give children security about where they sit which prevents anxiety about being left out; and to enable us to communicate effectively with the children. These arrangements will flex again once the weather is consistently good enough for us to eat outside. We are really keen for the children to enjoy the social side of lunchtimes as well as maintain excellent behaviours and safety. If parents can support these messages about table manners at home too, then we would really appreciate this.

Church Inspection: our 'National Society Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools Report has now been published and is attached to this newsletter. We are pleased that the Diocese still judges us to be 'Good' against their very stringent 'distinctive Church School' criteria. The process was a challenging one as we feel that we are as distinctively Christian and Church of England as is appropriate for our community and that there is little we would want to change in this respect: this sentiment was echoed by all who were consulted. Therefore, we have some development points we feel it would be good to address and some which we may choose not to follow, upon further consultation and consideration with the Governing Body and community.


