Newsletter 24 - 11.03.2022

Dear parents and carers,

Well, we never know quite what is around the corner do we? Sincere thanks for your understanding and quick action in response to the sudden and significant rise of positive COVID cases within our school community at the beginning of this week.

It was regretful that having finally felt able to begin to relax COVID safety measures last Friday, this was immediately followed by the highest number of positive cases experienced by West Dean since the pandemic began. I do hope that those who have been unwell this week are beginning to feel better and will be able to return to school soon – you have all very much been in our thoughts and prayers.

The number of new cases was at its highest on Monday, with several additional cases in the days following. I am pleased to say that there have been no new cases reported today (Friday), so I hope that this is a sign that the outbreak has plateaued and that the temporary measures put in place have had the desired impact.

Whilst some people may be able to return to school on Monday, following 5-day isolation and 2 negative tests 24hrs apart, it is not yet clear how many adults and children will be ready and fit to return. There is clearly a need to keep some COVID safety measures in place and operate a gradual return to normal school operation from Monday, as follows:

- All children should be LFD tested for COVID-19 before coming to school next Monday.
- From **Monday 14**th After School clubs and Care Bears will recommence and, where possible, will operate outside.
- Assembly and lunch will continue to happen in separate classrooms next week.
- The request to wear facemasks will continue until such time that we are confident that the outbreak has passed.
- Where curriculum enrichment (trips & visits etc.) can function without mixing class bubbles, these will go ahead as planned.

I was heartened to be approached by several of our children this week, who, amidst an unsettling period for their school friends and teachers, were also thinking really carefully about their global neighbours in a time of need. They asked me what we could do as a school to help the people of Ukraine.

Comic Relief have confirmed that some of the money raised during next Friday's Red Nose Day will be used to fund organisations that are supporting people right now in Ukraine, and those attempting to cross the border. So this is one way we can show our support for Ukraine next week, as well as for the vital work of many other organisations and charities.

The Week Junior children's newspaper made a digital version of last Friday's issue available free for everyone, as it featured information on the situation in Ukraine, how to talk to your children about this, and also various ways in which people in the UK are offering support. Here is the link:

As a small distraction from this saddening world news, it has been a joy to see signs of new spring life around school this week, with daffodils and crocus popping out in the grounds and huge excitement in Apple Class, as the children have watched tadpoles gradually emerge from the frogspawn collected from our school pond. The children have been observing and carefully documenting the tadpoles progress day by day and are so animated in their explanation of the details of each stage.

The tadpoles will of course be released back into the pond when they have grown a bit. Ms Boxall is currently working really hard to rejuvenate the pond and surrounding area, so that it is a nurturing home for the tadpoles and other wildlife, as well as becoming a great space for outdoor and scientific learning. There is much to do, including laying gravel paths, planting and erecting some new fence, so if you have any spare time to help at the weekends, or as the lighter evenings approach, please do get in touch with us.


