Dear parents, carers and children,

Welcome back to a new half term; I hope you all enjoyed a happy, healthy and fun break from school last week. Lent is upon us, as we look towards the celebration of Easter and hopefully the arrival of spring just around the corner. There is a definite sense of hope in the air and I don't know how you are in the mornings, but I am certainly enjoying the increasing daylight during my 6.15am dog walk each day!

As anticipated, during the half term break the Government announced the relaxing of COVID safety measures in England. Thank you for your cooperation in continuing with our pre-half term holiday measures for this first week.

Having reviewed the updated guidance for schools this week, and in light of the fact that it is no-longer a legal requirement to wear face masks, we are **removing the requirement to do so on the school site from Monday 7th March 2022.** We will remain vigilant to changing circumstances, and may reintroduce the request to wear a mask, should the need arise in the future. You are of course welcome to continue to wear a mask at school beyond Monday, if that is your preference.

The legal requirement to self-isolate if you test positive for COVID-19 has also been removed, although **public** health advice and guidance documentation remains unchanged on this matter. We can no-longer enforce self – isolation if your child tests positive, but ask that you do so, in line with Public Health advice, so that we can to continue to do all we can to keep West Dean healthy.

With Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday this week, our collective worship and assemblies have been about the start of Lent and the significance of this in a Christian community. Rev Sarah visited each class on Wednesday to talk to the children and answer questions. She has challenged them to consider the idea of 'giving', during Lent, rather than 'giving something up', in the form of doing a good deed for somebody each day, for 40 days. Your child has been given a card, on which the motif is divided into 46 sections—40 for Lent, and the other 6 for Holy Week, which follows Lent. The idea is to colour a section on each day that a good deed is done, resulting in a colourful card to give to someone special on Easter Day.

Another key part of our collective worship is an invitation to prayer or a period of reflection. I spoke to all of the children about the terrible, evolving situation in Ukraine, focusing on the facts as we know them, albeit at a level appropriate to the age of children in our school. We then focused our prayer and reflection on the people of Ukraine, that they may be supported in this time of need and led to safety. It is undoubtedly a challenging subject for us all, but most certainly for young children, who will pick up on things overheard on the television, radio or in adult conversation and will have questions and concerns. Please be assured that we have and will continue to answer their questions sensitively and appropriately, whilst offering as much reassurance as we are able in this time of uncertainty.

On a happier note, it was great to see Beech Class taking a walk to the greenhouses in West Dean Gardens yesterday to spark their curiosity about their Science work on Plant life. We've been doing a lot of work with West Dean College and Estate to nurture our special relationship and find ways to more closely link elements of our curriculum with the unique and special resource that they offer us. The estate and college are happy for us to visit more or less as often as we wish to, subject to prior agreement etc. This is wonderful and will enable all of our classes to engage in curriculum enrichment activities at West Dean far more frequently at little or no cost.

As I said at the start of my letter—spring is around the corner and there is a lot to look forward to.
