Dear parents, carers and children,

By the time you read this, we will have had our Harvest Festival service at St Andrew's church. I am so pleased that we are able to resume collective worship as a whole school at these special times of year and, at the time of writing this, am waiting with anticipation to visit the church for the first time with the children. It will of course be the first time that many of our children have been to our village church, and it feels really good to be reconnecting with the wider West Dean community. Thank you so much, for your most generous gifts this harvest time. You have contributed to a magnificent display, currently decorating the church and soon to be taken to the Chichester District Foodbank and put to good use for those in our community in need of support. You will notice that there are no Acorn Awards this week. It isn't that the children haven't been achieving, but due to our harvest service, we'll leave the awards until a bumper Acorn Assembly next week!

I have no doubt that the singing in church will be joyful, as the sound of the children practising their 'Harvest Samba' has been ringing out from the classrooms throughout this week, making us all dance our way along the corridors of the school! Apparently, the Chestnut children even sung their way along the M27 on Wednesday, as they embarked on their Titanic fact-finding mission to the SeaCity Museum in Southampton. The children were, once again, fine ambassadors for West Dean School, demonstrating impressive Titanic knowledge to the museum staff, as well as enthusiasm and curiosity to find out more. I had a fascinating conversation over lunch with several children today, who were telling me how shocked they were to learn of the unfairness of male first-class passengers being allowed off of the ship before the women and children in the lower classes. It was amazing to witness the empathy that they had for those involved in the Titanic tragedy.

Next week we have **special plans** to get out and about and reconnect in a different way. On **Tuesday 12th October** we are running a **Wellbeing Day**, beginning in the morning with a Wellbeing Walk to West Dean Gardens Arboretum. The aim of the day is to give the children the opportunity to collaborate and learn outside of the classroom, using all of their senses to connect with nature amidst the magical surroundings of the West Dean Estate. There has been a great deal of discussion in the media and from government about post COVID catch up. There is and will continue to be academic gaps in learning emerging as a result of the lockdown periods and addressing these is an absolutel priority for us. However, we passionately believe that to do this effectively, the children need to be in the right place as learners, ready to listen, take turns, share and collaborate. We hope that this special day will help the children find that readiness for learning, as well as providing a wonderful opportunity to learn alongside children from different year groups in a truly stunning outdoor setting.

The children will need to come to school in outdoor clothes on Tuesday, dressed as they would for a Forest School session - please leave school uniforms at home. They will each need a small rucksack to carry a water bottle and substantial healthy snack to fuel them on their walk. Normal school rucksacks are fine, the children will have the chance to remove any heavy and unnecessary equipment in school before we leave. We will be returning to school for lunch as normal.

Over the past few weeks whilst chatting to you on the playground, it has been interesting to listen to your feedback, both about the strengths of the school from your perspective and the aspects of school life in which you would welcome change. In addition to this week's newsletter, you will be sent a separate email with a link to a Parent Survey. The purpose of this survey is to gather information and views on a number of specific areas of school life, in order to inform our thinking, planning and ongoing school development this academic year.

There are 18 questions in total. If you are able, I would be most grateful if you could spare the time to answer the survey in as much detail as you can **by Friday 15th October**. As you can imagine, being new to West Dean, I have many questions and ideas. Your feedback is an immensely valuable part of school development, so sincere thanks for your time and attention to the survey.

Measuring seven metres in diameter, the *Museum of the Moon* features 120dpi detailed NASA imagery of the lunar surface. At an approximate scale of 1:500,000, each centimetre of the internally-lit spherical sculpture represents 5km of the moon's surface. The artwork will be accompanied by a programme of events, concerts and latenight openings, delivered by a variety of organisations, including the South

Downs Planetarium, Chichester's Novium Museum and the West Sussex Library Service, encouraging people far and wide to celebrate the night skies of Sussex. Read on below to find out more. General day entry will not be ticketed or pre-booked, however a variety of events and evening viewings will need pre-booking.
