


We do our best in all we do, with God's love. 'Love one another. As I have loved you, so must you love one another.

Dear parents, carers and children,

It has been a lovely week in school, with the welcome return of swimming at the Westgate Centre and an inspiring trip to Chichester Festival Theatre for the children in Beech and Chestnut Class. I am so pleased that, despite the continued need for caution around COVID safety, these enriching learning activities are able to happen.

The performance of *Fantastically Great Women who Changed the World* is to be highly recommended if you ever have the chance to see it. It is exciting, energetic and enlightening in equal measure, with such an important core message of hope, and encouragement to 'be' the change that makes a difference in our world.



Having looked at the book of the same name, written by Kate Pankhurst, who is distantly related to suffragette, Emmeline Pankhurst, the children already had some background knowledge of the amazing personal stories of each of the women who feature in the production, including Frida Kahlo, Marie Curie, Mary Seacole, and Rosa Parks, to name but a few. It was wonderful to see the children's reaction when they recognised each of these amazing women, as their story was brought to life on stage.

Back in school we've discussed some of the key messages from the performance in assembly today, hopefully helping the children to understand that change can often feel scary or uncomfortable at first, but that the outcome is almost always positive. Inspired by the actions of the central character in the performance, a ten-year-old girl called Jade, the children have also been asked to think about the way in which they can take responsibility for change. Not necessarily with grand gestures or incredible adventures, but in their own small way by adjusting their own actions and behavior in the interest of others and the wider world.

Such a valuable learning experience for our children, which I hope they have been able to share with you at home, by retelling the stories and facts about these fantastically great women.
