Dear Parents and Carers,

And now for the information you are all waiting for: Wider School Reopening

You will be aware of the plethora of information and guidance out there about schools reopening. The government have even suggested a date and some possible priority year groups: 1st June and YR, Y1 and Y6.

I want to make it clear that this is by no means certain, nationally, locally or for our school. The government have some criteria to adhere to before they deem this appropriate and safe, although it remains their 'ambition'. It is also their 'ambition' to have all pupils back at some point before the end of July: again, this is by no means certain.

I am keeping abreast of global, national and local developments, and keeping in touch with our parental and governor views too. Thank you to our parents of YR, Y1 and Y6 pupils who replied to our questionnaire. I will endeavour to keep our plans similar to other local schools but am not promising that – we will do whatever is right for our own school community.

These are the only things we are certain about:

- From 1st June, we will be open for the **children of key workers** as we currently are.
- When it is safe to open more widely we will do so, with all staff in school to ensure the small group sizes and additional restrictions and hygiene measures are in place.
- Any additional adult or child in school with us **increases the risk** to everyone in school, and the wider community (our families and friends, and others we come into contact with), even if this increase in risk is small.
- For any pupils in school **we will continue to do our utmost** to keep them, our staff and the wider community safe:
 - We will support children in school in washing their hands as they come in and before they go home, and at transitions in school (before and after lunch, before and after playtime) as well as after visiting the loo or sneezing etc.
 - We will keep groups of children and individuals apart when working and eating as much as possible, eg: one to a table at lunch times.
 - We will educate children as well as possible.
 - We will cater for their emotional wellbeing as well as possible.
 - We will clean resources, surfaces, etc frequently during the day and rotate resources used to minimise infection spread (some toys/equipment may be used on a Monday morning and then put away until the following week, for example). Other resources will be kept specific to each child, if possible, eg: KS2 pupils' pens and pencils.
 - We cannot guarantee social distancing.
 - We cannot guarantee absolute hygiene.
 - Staff and pupils will not wear masks etc: PPE will only be worn by staff when dealing with pupils who develop symptoms of Covid-19 whilst in school. In these cases, we are advised to send the child home, wear a mask and gloves when we communicate with the child, and then clean the area once they have gone home.
 - Children will not always be with their usual classroom staff.
- Not everyone will be in agreement with our decision.
- Parents will not be judged by us or fined by the government for not sending children into school.
- We have families in our school community where parents report they are sure they have had the virus several weeks ago, and families who report that they are recovering from it at the moment, despite only venturing out very very occasionally (to the shop or Drs surgery). At least two families suspect their children have experienced symptoms of the related inflammatory disease - see link below.
- **Testing** is only available to us as staff if we, or someone in our families, have developed symptoms: in this case we have to take the test and then await results whilst isolating at home.
- The United Kingdom is more 'in the grip' of the virus than on 20th March when we closed our doors to pupils:

UK new Covid cases daily:	20 th March = 714	14 th May = 3446
UK daily Covid deaths daily:	20 th March = 36	14 th May = 428

There are many things which remain uncertain:

- ⇒ We do not know which children will return to school and when this will be we will wait for up to date guidance and data nearer the time before a decision is reached.
- ⇒ We do not know how the virus (or the related rare inflammatory disease linked to coronavirus) affects children, although children appear to be less likely to experience serious symptoms.
- \Rightarrow We do not know **how** children transmit the virus.
- \Rightarrow We do not know how the current **easing of 'lockdown'** will impact on national data and the health of the nation and our area.
- ⇒ We do not know **how long** some form of restriction may last as a country or as a school
- ⇒ We do not know when a **vaccine** will be available, although this is likely to be several months away.
- ⇒ We do not know what the **final guidance** for schools will be about when to open, who to open for and how to open: unions, Headteachers and national and local government representatives are meeting on Monday, and regularly, to discuss this.
- ⇒ We must plan to, and begin to, move towards a less restricted way of life and get our economy back on its feet. In order to do this and for many other reasons, including the effective education of our children, we must return to a more 'normal' education system, with safety a huge priority.

My messages for you all as parents, as of today, are to:

- Remain **positive**
- Stay as **safe** as possible:
 - Be very vigilant in shops, for example, where some people are 'letting their guard down'.
 - Avoid any crowded spaces.
 - Maintain the hygiene advice in your homes.
 - Eat and drink healthily.
 - Get plenty of exercise, outdoors if you can do this safely.
 - When you send your children back to school, we want all the children to be as low a threat to one another as possible - we are currently all being so careful and are concerned about relaxing this.
- Avoid giving your children any hard and fast information at this time, as things may change.
- Stay abreast of news and data (without alarming your children or becoming overly worried yourselves).
- **Encourage others** around you not to flout the guidance in their lives outside of the family home and inside their family groups.

These messages are easier to hear and follow for some than for others. I am acutely aware that many of you are desperately trying to work from home. Some of you need to, and are expected to, return to work soon. Some of you are very afraid of sending your children back to school and engaging with the wider community. Many of you are waiting for definitive advice and feel as though you are 'sitting on the fence'.

Please stay 'on the fence' until you are absolutely sure about what is right for your child and your family. There will be no judgement about your decision. If we open school for your child's year group and you are still unsure, we will continue with the home learning support to the best of our ability. If you choose for your child to return, we are really proud of the great learning taking place, but please remember that we are juggling staffing in order to cater for all pupils (at home and school) and keep everyone as safe as possible.

I will keep everyone informed as much as possible so that you can make sound decisions. In the meantime, there is a lot of information available: here are links to information I have referred to, regarding the virus in children and global statistics over time.

On the class pages there are streamlined teaching notes, resources and activities for **English and maths**. We suggest that you do this in the mornings, following your own learning timetable. We aim to provide support and extension so that you can find learning at the correct 'level' for your own children.


We encourage you to **post images** and information about your home learning, securely on the class pages, so that we can have a window into everyone's achievement. You can do this by logging onto the website and using the 'new message' tab. You will find your teachers' names in the recipients' box, then you can give your message a name (or 'subject') and type a message. You can then 'attach' pictures, in the same way you might add images to a text or email. The **discussion tabs** will be restored soon - this will be a great way of communicating with friends in the class.

Your **teachers** will liaise with you via the class pages, about learning—they will also let you know when to expect them to be 'on-line'. Please don't worry or be frustrated if you don't get an immediate response, as our staff are teaching in the classroom, working on planning etc behind the scenes and managing their own health & well-being too.

We suggest that the afternoons should be focused on more practical, outdoors, collaborative 'topic' work, and we have selected a mini topic for each week, to help us to cover all curriculum areas. this learning can be found **on the main website** homepage, away form the secure class pages. Clicking on the **HOME LEARNING** tab will take you directly to this new area, which is being added to over the coming weeks. You will also see the recipes section, where you can try making some lovely dishes, and email pictures of your successes to Mrs Muggeridge: SMuggeridge@westdean.w-sussex.sch.uk. Mrs Muggeridge will then make a gallery of your lovely meals for the website.

There is a huge and potentially **overwhelming array of resources** 'out there' on the internet at the moment. We are being bombarded in school by this sort of thing and are endeavouring to 'cherry pick' the best learning resources for you—so please don't feel that your children are missing out if you restrict yourselves to the school website—there is more than enough learning available here, without you spending hours trawling through online resources. We will try to give you ideas to 'stretch/extend' your children if they progress well and to support them if they find some aspects trickier. This is easier to do if we are with them, but we will do our best! We have an area for 'links to a variety of teacher resources' and we will put other things on there for anyone who does want to trawl for other ideas. This week there is a new page of links here.... So many resources!

There are also some lovely **community ideas**, activities and suggestions, such as sending rainbow pictures to the new Nightingale hospitals—A4 only for laminating, putting rainbow pictures and teddy bears in windows to make us all smile when we are out walking...... Please share these on the class pages and in your class WhatsApp parent groups. If you have not tried **Zoom** to communicate with groups of family and friends, please give it a go: this has already been very successful for home pupil-teacher video links, Book Club sessions etc and is password protected and planned in advance.
