Dear parents and carers,

As the spring term draws to a close, I thank you for your continued support throughout what has at times been a tricky few weeks in the life of the school. COVID Update

I sincerely hope that all of our school families remain healthy during the Easter break and that we are able to start the Summer term with the whole community back together in school.

You will have seen from our communication to you last week, that as Friday 1st April, all COVID related operational guidance for schools has been removed, meaning that there is no longer a requirement or indeed the facility to test for COVID-19, nor a requirement to self isolate.

From this point forwards, the advice, although very limited, is simply that anyone who feels unwell, particularly with a high temperature, should stay at home until they feel better.

We all hope that this change in guidance is a signal that we can return to pre-pandemic operations in safety and with confidence, including being able to welcome families into school much more frequently. However, I want to assure you that we will still do all we can to ensure a safe learning environment for everyone in our school community. Please use The Riverwood Entrance (Green Sign). Drop off is between 12 noon - 4pm on Wednesday and 10am - 2pm on Saturday. Please do not bring items at any other time. The goods needed include, nappies, tin food (that can be opened without a tin opener and is rich in protein), cup-a-soup and energy bars, blankets and good quality, warm clothing. If you can bring items in a cardboard box, that would be helpful.



A reminder to all families that in order to safeguard children and adults with an allergy or intolerance to nuts, we ask that nuts and food products containing nuts are not brought into school.

We are pleased to be able to offer a programme of after school activities again for the summer term. All clubs run from 3.00-4.00, with the exception of Cookery Club which finishes at 4.15. For all clubs and care bears, you can make your bookings on-line at Schoolmoney.co.uk.

Places for clubs are limited and will be allocated on 'first come, first served' basis. Please collect your child from the Reception area. Children will only be released to parents or carers unless we have been notified of alternative arrangements.
