

Attendance



Dance Club and Dance House 2026. Dance Club 2026 will be open to all children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 and booking will be on a 'first come first serve' basis. Booking will be available on Arbor on Tuesday 6th January at 6pm to make it fair for everyone to have a chance to access this. If there are spaces available this will then be open to children in Year 2.

Children will sign up for the whole 14 weeks leading up to participation in the Dance House event which will take place in the evening of Tuesday 19th May 2026, with an afternoon rehearsal. Further details of this will be communicated to you nearer the time. The cost for the 14 sessions will be £84 per child in total, £6 per session to include a contribution towards the Dance House costumes. There will be an option to pay this in instalments if you so wish.

Dance Club will be open again for everyone after May half term and will revert back to the £5 cost per session. Numbers for the Dance House event is capped by the organiser at 19 and we therefore cannot exceed this in our Dance Club and are sorry if some are disappointed on this occasion.


