Magic Moments

As parents I am sure you will have wondered on many occasion whether anything you say and try to instil in your children is actually heard by them. As the father of two teenage boys I ask myself this question on a daily basis, as I do as a headteacher, as I regularly stand leading worship in front of 102 faces, trying to communicate life lessons on how to be a good citizen.

Here's the good news; every now and then there is a moment of magic that proves that our children are in fact listening, and these positive messages that we are all trying so desperately hard to convey are sinking in.

I had the privilege to witness one such magic moment as I accompanied our cross country runners to the Chichester locality races at Bishop Luffa School this week.

We've been talking about teamwork, resilience and perseverance a lot in school lately, using various metaphors including 'running life's race'. These real races on real grass (well, mud mostly) with a hundred or so real competitors lining up next to you are no metaphor; they feel very real and very daunting.

Our team members were not intimidated in the slightest.



With smiles on their faces throughout, they ran their shoes off (quite literally in some cases—Reuben!). The grit and determination on show from each and every one of them around the entirety of the 2.5km course was phenomenal.

Some of our runners achieved really good placings as they crossed the finish line, with Max and Ned both qualifying to represent West Sussex West area at the Sussex County Championship races. Congratulations and well done to them. Some of our runners were near, or at the back—but that's not what matters. What matters is the attitude that they applied throughout. They never gave up, they enjoyed every moment and they felt a sense of personal achievement regardless of their finishing position.

But even that is not the magic moment I'm talking about. This came when one of our runners, who may well have been at the very back of the pack, rounded the final bend as was joined by the whole team, all of whom had long since finished their own race. They jogged alongside him, smiling, clapping and cheering him on as if he was about to win an Olympic Gold. And in his own way he did, because he never gave up and he never stopped smiling.

So take comfort parents, I think they are listening to us. I think they know what to value most and they definitely know how to work as a team and support each other. Well done runners—you made me a very proud headteacher on Wednesday.

Poetic Perfection

Chestnut Class joined Year 5 and 6 children from all of the Bishop Luffa Learning Partnership primary schools for a morning of poetic inspiration on Tuesday. They watched some poets perform their work life on stage in the Bartlett Hall at Bishop Luffa and then worked with them to begin creating their own poetry. This event launched the latest BLLP joint learning project which will continue throughout the term, culminating in a poetry sharing event just before Easter.

The poets clearly had the desired inspiring impact on the children too and definitely ignited a spark for some. 

I am an acorn,

Universal Free School Meals

Thank you for supporting us with your careful meal ordering. Since the beginning of the Spring term we have had significantly reduced the number of meals ordered but not taken. Other than when there has been illness we have had x1 at a cost of £3.20.

This is a huge improvement and helps us both financially and in terms of food waste.

We are aware that there has been significant discussion lately about Chartwells school meal provision. The Chartwells contract will be coming to an end this coming July and we will soon be in a position to share more details about a new provider for September 2026.

Calling all Runners!

It will soon be time for some of our Year 5 and 6 runners to compete in the annual Chichester Corporate Challenge races.

Encouraged by our friends at Lavant Primary, who entered an adult team last year, there was some enthusiasm for West Dean to do the same this year. We have decided to join forces and enter one combined Bishop Luffa Learning Partnership Team. Mr Williams and our Chair of Governors, Edward Younghusband have promised to run, but we're sure there are more keen beans out there who would like to join us. The three races are on the evening of **25th Feb, 11th & 25th March** and is 4.5km in length for adults.






